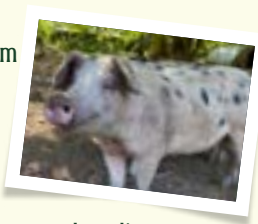

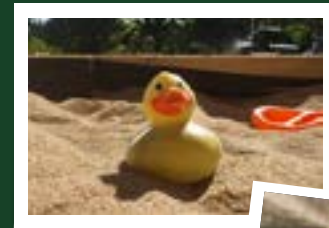
THORNBRIDGE ESTATE

'The quietest stately home in the UK'



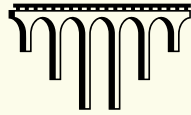
The famously quirky Thornbridge Hall is surrounded by quintessentially English formal gardens, designed in the 1890's to create a vision of a 'thousand shades of green'. They are a perfect example of Victorian engineering to manipulate the landscape into a series of garden rooms.

First opened to the public in the 1930's, areas include, an Italian Garden, water garden, grottos, Kitchen Garden, Scented Terrace and Koi Lake amongst others.
